

### Entry requirements


Applicants must have an undergraduate degree in any business related area from a New Zealand tertiary institution accredited to offer qualifications at this level or an undergraduate degree from an overseas tertiary institution, deemed by the New Zealand Qualifications Authority to be of equivalent standing or equivalent practical, professional or educational experience.

Applicants are required to provide two confidential references from people able to affirm the applicant is of good character and reputation. All applicants will be interviewed to assess their suitability for the programme.

### English language requirements

IELTS overall academic score of at least 6.5 with no band width score lower than 6.0 issued within the last two years or equivalent.

## Post Graduate Diploma in IT Security Management - Level 8 (120 Credits)

Using a balance of practical work, case studies and theory, this programme will develop your leadership, communication, innovation and project management skills. You will develop your knowledge of critical IT security requirements including those related to network and software, operations, risk management, protection mechanisms, planning, disaster recovery, and governance.

Applicants must have an undergraduate degree in any discipline related to IT, computer science, or information systems from a New Zealand tertiary institution accredited to offer those qualifications at that level, or a degree in one of these disciplines from a foreign tertiary institution deemed by the New Zealand Qualifications Authority to be of equivalent standing. Applicants may be interviewed to assess their suitability for the programme

## Services include:

### Student career advice and job seeking

Career advice and guidance, in addition to preparing for work in New Zealand, we provide workshops in job seeking, job applications, resume preparation, and interview techniques. We are also able to connect you with our many industry networks and potential employers and coordinate work placements and internships.

### Counselling and pastoral care

Develop a rich research culture that supports and engages learners and staff and contributes to new knowledge and understanding in fields related to ATMC NZ's programmes.


## ATMC NZ's research goals are to:

Sometimes, their research is presented at national and international conferences or published in magazines and journals both in New Zealand and abroad.

Most of the programmes at ATMC, provide the opportunity for students to undertake their own research, whilst being supported by a research supervisor. This is often enabled through capstone projects focused on generating solutions to real world problems. Research activities will enable you to develop deeper understandings of your chosen industry and will also better prepare you for further postgraduate level study should you choose to continue your studies.

# How to Apply

## STEP 01

Choose your programme and check if you meet the academic and English language entry requirements.



## STEP 02

Apply with the registered list of agents for ATMC NZ in your country.



## STEP 03

Once your application is complete and we have received all necessary documentation from your agent, it will be assessed by ATMC NZ staff.



## STEP 04

If your application is successful ATMC NZ will issue you an offer of place. Accept your offer of place by following the instructions in your offer letter.



## STEP 05

Apply for a student visa at Immigration New Zealand (INZ).



## STEP 06

Once your AIP is issued by INZ, you will need to pay your tuition fees, then obtain health and travel insurance through ATMC NZ, before leaving your country.



# Important Information



## Living Costs

In addition to your tuition fees, you will need to pay for textbooks and your personal expenses. If you enter New Zealand on a student visa, Immigration **New Zealand** requires you to have access to NZ\$15,000 in addition to your course fees for each year **you will** be studying in New Zealand, plus an additional NZ\$2,000 to cover a return ticket home.


