or

A professional qualification

or

The ability to demonstrate competencies equivalent to 1, 2 or 3

HOW TO APPLY

1

Choose your programme and check if you meet the academic and English language entry requirements.

2

Apply with the registered list of agents for ATMC NZ in your country or apply directly if you are a domestic student.

3

Once your application is complete and we have received all necessary documentation from your agent, it will be assessed by ATMC NZ staff

4

If your application is successful ATMC NZ will issue you an offer of place. Accept your offer of place by following the instructions in your offer letter.

5

Apply for a student visa at Immigration New Zealand (INZ).

6

Once your Approval in Principle (AIP) is issued by INZ, you **will** need to pay your tuition fees, then obtain health and travel insurance through ATMC NZ, before leaving your country.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION



In addition to your tuition fees, you will need to pay for textbooks and your personal expenses. If you enter New Zealand on a student visa, Immigration New Zealand requires you to have access to NZ\$20,000 in addition to your course fees for each year you will be studying in New Zealand, plus an additional NZ\$2,000 to cover a return ticket home.
